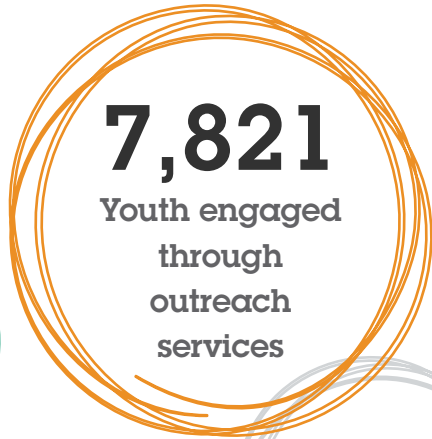


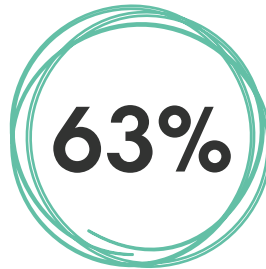

A Safe Place for All Youth.

Youth T stayed with us on two separate occasions. She was with us while she was pregnant and then came back with her infant child when she felt she was not safe where she was living. Her previous stay with us had shown her that we were a safe place for her and her baby. The youth's traumatic experiences showed up in how she initially interacted with staff and her distrust of the system.

Our approach exemplified our work as trauma informed youth providers and as a journey-oriented, collaborative community. T was approved for a FUP (Family Unification Program) voucher, which subsidizes her housing for three years. She and her son now live in a small home and have been there for over a year. T collaborates with staff and members of the greater community to access the wraparound supports and the resources she needs to make positive strides on her path to self-reliance.

T returns to The Bridge for our community events and participates in aftercare mental health services. T amplifies her voice in youth leadership opportunities whenever possible to change the very systems and policies that impacted her ability to thrive so that others can.
