


Housing Options for Young Families **Experiencing Homelessness**



The Bridge for Youth Request:

The Bridge for Youth (BFY) is requesting \$3.5 million in state funds for pre-design, design, property acquisition, project management, construction, and occupancy for 25 total housing units in Hennepin County for youth (ages 16+) who are pregnant and/or parenting who have experienced homelessness. Of the 25 units, 10 are transitional living (expanding an existing portfolio from 5 to 15 units) and 15 are non time limited supportive housing for young families (a new portfolio).

By providing immediate housing stability for young families experiencing homelessness, this investment addresses the unique needs of pregnant and/or parenting youth and their children. It expands opportunities to secure safe and stable long-term housing; and empowers youth to increase their levels of safety, well-being, connections, and self-sufficiency. These supports disrupt multi-generational and adult homelessness, as well as maintains family unification and prevents systems involvement.

How the Project was Informed:

- Jan 2021 Project completion > The Bridge's Youth Advisory Board (YAB) Consulting, informing, and advising on all phases of the project.
- Jan 2021 July 2021 > John Paul Chaisson Cardenas Strategic plan prioritizes program and housing expansion for young families by centering youth voice.
- Sept 2021 May 2022 > Dunwoody College of Technology Youth and staff engagement, project goals, and trauma informed design and conceptualization by 5th year architecture students.
- Sept 2021 Present > Joy Collaborative Project consultation through all phases
- Dec 2022 Aug 2023 > Healthcare Reparations (MN Housing capacity building grant) Youth and community engagement, young families program design, input into ideal housing infrastructure and amenities

Housing Options

Transitional Living Program (10 units) Non-Time Limited Supportive Housing (15 units)

- Individual units: Trauma designed and youth informed
- Designed for and by young families
- Community and learning space, therapeutic and play areas, near public transit, access to critical resources, educational and employment opportunities, healthcare, and child care

Supportive Services

- Culturally responsive and youth informed holistic programming
- Basic needs- food, housing, clothing, personal care
- Case management and aftercare services
- Access to pre- and post-natal healthcare and birthing supports
- Individual and family therapeutic supports
- Parenting education, mentorship, health education, and support groups
- Young Father's programming
- Life skills addressing the whole self
- Recreational activities and community building for the whole family
